8 **UNDERREPRESENTED GROUPS IN THE**

9 **WAKE OF INDIANA HOUSE BILL 1608**

15 **WHEREAS,**

16 Recently, Indiana House Bill 1608 was passed in the Indiana Senate which

17 entails that a school, an employee or staff member of a school, or a third-party

18 vendor used by a school to provide instruction may not provide instruction to a

19 student in kindergarten through third grade on human sexuality (iga.in.gov);

21 **WHEREAS,**

22 Further, House Bill 1608 “provides that an employee or staff member of a school

23 may only use a name, pronoun, title, or other word to identify a student that is

24 inconsistent with the student's sex if the student, who is an adult or an

25 emancipated minor, or the parent of an unemancipated minor requests in writing

26 the use of a specific name, pronoun, title, or other word to identify the student,”

27 (iga.in.gov);

29 **WHEREAS,**

30 Indiana House Bill 1608 requires a school to notify the parent of a certain student

31 if they request to change their name, pronoun, title, and/or other word to identify

32 themselves that is deemed inconsistent with their sex at birth (iga.in.gov);

33

34 **WHEREAS,**

35 Further, House Bill 1608 provides that a school may not discipline an employee

36 or staff member of the school for using a name, pronoun, title, and/or other word

37 to identify a student that is deemed consistent with the student's legal name and

38 sex at birth (iga.in.gov);

40 **WHEREAS,**

41 This is concerning due to harmful narratives surrounding human sexuality being

42 spread to those whose minds are the most vulnerable;

44 **WHEREAS,**

45 Indiana House Bill 1608 is extremely similar to Florida House Bill 1557, both of

46 which intend to prohibit gender expression and discussions of human sexuality in

47 classrooms;

48

49 **WHEREAS,**

50 In regard to the Florida House Bill 1557, which went into effect on July, 1, 2022,

51 it requires district school boards to notify and inform the parents of a student if

52 that student wants to make a critical decision relating to their mental, emotional,

53 and/or physical wellbeing, prohibits classroom discussions about sexual

54 orientation or gender identity in certain grade levels, and requires school districts

55 to notify parents of healthcare services (flsenate.gov);

57 **WHEREAS,**

58 Since Florida House Bill 1557 has been in effect, it has had a negative impact on

59 students' mental health in primary schools and suicide and self-harm rate for

60 LGBTQ+ youth increased significantly from the 42% in 2021 (The Georgetown

61 Journal of Gender and the Law);

63 **WHEREAS,**

64 Since Indiana House Bill 1608 is extremely similar to the Florida bill, it poses

65 similar harmful effects to take place for LGBTQ+ youth, and more;

67 **WHEREAS,**

68 Kelley Student Government condemns the hate and misidentification of

69 individuals;

59 **WHEREAS,** While Indiana's House Bill 1608 will not directly impact collegiate education in
60 the state of Indiana, we want to ensure Kelley remains equitable;

84 BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

86 **SECTION 1.** Kelley Student Government publishes the text of this resolution across its social
87 media platforms.

89 **SECTION 2.** Kelley Student Government calls upon the Kelley administration to create spaces
90 for its LGBTQ+ underrepresented populations and meet with Out at Kelley to
91 find ways to continue fostering an inclusive environment at the Kelley School of
92 Business.

94 **SECTION 3.** Kelley Student Government shall commission focus groups to learn how to better
95 uplift and support diverse populations during such times of distress and be a
96 resource for communities suffering from the lack of support from their federal
97 and local governments.

99 **SECTION 4.** Upon passage by the General Assembly and signature of the Kelley Student
